### COUNCIL BRIEFS

- Council is providing a recycling drop-off point on weekdays for two weeks from Monday, 20 December through to Friday, 31 December 2021, excluding public holidays. The drop-off point will be available at Jamison Park from 3pm until 6pm.  
Council will be accepting excess household recyclables that would normally go in the yellow-lidded recycling bin. Items accepted include wrapping paper, cardboard boxes, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and containers, and steel and aluminium cans.  
Polystyrene will not be accepted at the drop-off, however, clean, white polystyrene can be dropped off for free at Penrith's Community Recycling Centre.
